**Sermon Title: The Man Who Liberates Prisoners**

**Scripture text(s): Galatians 3:15-23, Genesis 12: 1-3, 15:2-18**

- 6) Richard used the analogy of a glass of water that contains sand(sin). It settles to the bottom and the water appears to be pure. But a spoon(law) stirs the water and gets the sand(sin) stirred up. How do you react when God "stirs up" the sin in your life?
- 7) What does it mean if sin is being stirred up in you?
