## Mark 11

*(7) When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. (8) Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields.*

## Mark 11

*(9 )Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, “Hosanna!” “Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”*

## Luke 19

## Matthew 21

## Luke 19

## Matthew 27

*(50) And when Jesus had cried out again in a loud voice, he gave up his spirit. (51) At that moment ... The earth shook, the rocks split (52) and the tombs broke open.*



## Matthew 27

*The bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life. (53) They came out of the tombs after Jesus' resurrection and went into the holy city and appeared to many people.*

## Luke 19

*(41) As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it (42) and said, “If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes.*

## Revelation 19

*(11) I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a **white horse**, whose rider is called **Faithful and True**. With justice he judges and wages war. (12) His eyes are like blazing fire, and on his head are many **crowns**. . . .*

## Revelation 19

*(13) He is dressed in a robe dipped in blood, and his name is the Word of God. (14) The armies of heaven were following him, riding on white horses and dressed in fine linen, white and clean. (15) Coming out of his mouth is a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations.*
